Growing in Christ : Empower Me!

On Saturday, September 30, 2017 the Children's Department held a workshop, Empower Me! When we read the Bible, we find verses on God's power throughout the Old Testament and the New Testament. All three parts of the Godhead share power—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Each demonstrates power differently and shows the various ways to display power. The Old Testament shows God's might in his protection of his people, the Israelites. God exhibits soft power in His promise of His Son, who will come as a babe that will live among men. In the New Testament, Jesus employs his power to heal the sick, give sight to the blind, cure insanity, make the lame walk, and feed the poor. In the New Testament, the Holy Spirit spreads its power to the disciples so that they can boldly preach the Gospel and continue Jesus' healing, caring ministry.

Why should we want to empower our children? How do we define the power that we want to give them? Developing power in children, as in adults, allows them to be more thoughtful, seek future fulfillment rather than immediate pleasure, to be resilient, alert, and willing to fight for principles that they learn in Sunday School and Children's Church. People who have power normally live longer, healthier, and wealthier lives than those of similar health, age, and economic status that feel powerless. Power, like achievement, is a basic human drive.

What power has God given to our children? Man has created an unjust world, with income, education, job, and other disparities getting more pronounced every day. For that reason, the church should provide children a place to cultivate their power by constructing a positive image and reputation—teaching in Sunday School, leading Children's Church, being presidents of Junior Ushers, Angel Choir, Teen Ministry, and all organizations they participate. We should constantly give them the opportunity to practice and encourage their efforts to achieve power.

Qualities of Power

Ambition :

Try something hard or something outside your comfort zone.

Energy:

Expend effort on what is important. Energize the people around you to achieve. Show commitment and loyalty. Stick to the task until the end.

Focus:

Excel in what you do best. Complete what is most important first. Ignore distractions, such as Facebook, the smart phone, television.

Self-Knowledge:

Keep a diary of your strengths and weaknesses. Write a plan to improve your strengths and eliminate weaknesses.

Confidence:

Lead a group, contribute to class discussion, ask the teacher for help if you don't understand a concept.

Empathy:

For all the people you do not like or distrust, write three sentences on how you believe they think of themselves

Capacity to Tolerate Conflict:

Stand up for yourself if opposed by a bully by going to a teacher, parent, or other adult.
